## **Sea monster at library soon See it for yourself**

The sea is not the only thing sea monsters and submarines have in common. They will both be larger than life on the InfoZone News Museum's big screen!

On June 11, come and see the movie based on the book "20,000 Leagues Under the Sea" by Jules Verne in the InfoZone at 4 p.m. The book is set in the 1850s where a "sea monster" is destroying ships in the ocean. Three shipwrecked men end up inside of the "monster," which turns out to be a submarine.

The three men travel with the ship's commander, Captain Nemo, as he explores the ocean bottom and attacks more ships. A giant sea squid attacks the sub, but is killed.

After Nemo's island base is invaded, he blows it up rather than having his secrets discovered. When Nemo and his crew choose to scuttle the Nautilus on the ocean bottom, the three passengers escape to safety.

The movie is from Walt Disney and stars Kirk Douglas, James Mason, Paul Lukas and Peter Lorre. The featured movie will be shown at 4 p.m. and is free to the public. Seating is first come, first served. For more information, please call 562-5604.
