CSU-Pueblo Student Documentary Chronicles Last Years of CF&I Film debuts on InfoZone Screen

Students of this spring's CSU-Pueblo's mass communications documentary class have chronicled the unique bond among steel workers who operated the CF&I plant during its final years of operation.

Entitled "Forged in Steel: The Colorado Fuel and Iron Company," the 20 minute documentary will be shown free to the public on Thursday, April 29 at 7 p.m. in the InfoZone News Museum located on the top floor of the Robert Hoag Rawlings Public Library.

Local steel workers participated in the documentary that uses local footage and interviews to capture the relationship among steel workers at the mill, according to Sue Wronski, instructor and KTSC Rocky Mountain PBS producer.

A small reception will be held at 6 p.m. and the documentary will be aired at 7 p.m. Those who attend are invited to stay afterwards to discuss the topic.

From south I-25, take the 98B/First Street exit. Turn left onto First Street, left on Union Avenue, left on Abriendo Ave. and left on Bates Lane.
