Inside Scoop

- The InfoZone's current theme is water and its importance to Pueblo and the Southern Colorado region. The theme will change in the future, once more videos are produced. Future themes will include: Southern Colorado sports, education, transportation, the Steel Mill and others.
- The InfoZone will be hosting movie nights for small groups at least once a month. Best of all, it's free. We offer a safe and inviting place for families and youth to gather and spend quality time together enjoying movies on the big screen. Initial movies will highlight winners from the Sundance and Toronto Film Festivals.
- We will soon be sponsoring contests both community wide and in the schools for print art and photography. Winners' work will be presented in the InfoZone Community Gallery.
- The InfoZone's large projection screen can be reserved for business, school, personal and nonprofit presentations. It is for rent by itself or in conjunction with the Ryals Special Events Room, which offers a catering kitchen, green room and A/V capabilities. The InfoZone's big screen can accommodate DVD, VHS and laptop presentation forms and the room has a capacity of up to 100 people.
- A book about the newsboy carriers who have worked for *The Pueblo Chieftain* and *The Star-Journal* will be forthcoming after the first of the year. The book will contain first hand anecdotes about newsies' experiences as carriers and submissions from family members about the tradition of being a newsie. When possible, photos of the newsies and their families will be included with their stories.
- Several InfoZone volunteers were former linotype operators in newspaper press rooms and print shops. The knowledge and insight they provide is great for patrons. These volunteers also have many great anecdotal stories from their days On the job.
- Standards based curriculum will be given to teachers who tour the InfoZone News Museum with their classes. Curriculum includes 10 InfoZone/Pueblo lessons incorporating history, science, math and reading/writing. Students will also have the opportunity to build their own front page of a newspaper as a class or individual project.
