## **Sword fights, wars and love shown on a larger than life screen!**

Yes, you read right. Coming to the InfoZone News Museum this Friday is movie of love and war, complete with heroism! Make plans to attend the 4 p.m. showing of *Ivanhoe*, a classic medieval tale!

Watch on the 10'x18' projection screen as knights battle to the death, the fate of England hangs in the balance. England is in turmoil--torn by fierce and bitter hatreds between Norman and Saxon. Rival claimants to the throne have plunged into bloody civil war. Prince John--taking advantage of Richard's absence while fighting in the Crusades--plots to make himself crowned king. Richard returns and vows to take his revenge on John. But he will need a courageous and able warrior on his side--a warrior like Wilfred of Ivanhoe.

Disinherited by his father, disowned and dishonored, Wilfred allies himself with Richard. In many adventures he will battle knights in deadly tournaments, scale castle walls, be wounded, captured, and rescued by the infamous Robin Hood, and find true love with the fiery Rowena.

In what has become Sir Walter Scott's most beloved and rousing adventure, Wilfred helps Richard I foil John's plot. More importantly, Wilfred of Ivanhoe reclaims his good name.

The InfoZone is located on the fourth floor of the Robert Hoag Rawlings Public Library, which is a co-sponsor in the classic film series. The series, shown on the second Friday of each month, features movies based on books like *20,000 Leagues Under the Sea*, *Dr. Jeckyll and Mr. Hyde*, *Jayne Eyre* and many more.

The featured movie is free to the public and seating is on a first-come first-serve basis. Patrons can begin arriving 10 minutes before the showing to choose seats.
