Sports films coming to InfoZone's screens! InfoZone theme about to change!

Make plans to visit the InfoZone exhibit to see your favorite "water" videos one last time before they are gone.

The InfoZone is preparing to debut a new set of films based on the theme of "Southern Colorado Sports." The current "water" theme videos will continue to run through the first of May when the new theme is implemented.

The new theme videos are being produced by Brad Padula from Capture It Productions of Pueblo. The new theme will feature Earl Dutch Clark, Pueblo Dodgers as the past farm team for the Brooklyn Dodgers and recreational water sports. The video produced for the large projection screen will showcase a number of sports in southern Colorado including football, basketball, baseball, volleyball, motor sports and rodeo.

The segments featuring the hot-type process and the current method of newspaper production as seen through the eyes of a Pueblo Chieftain newsgirl will remain in the exhibit for the foreseeable future.

Only four of its kind in the world, the InfoZone is an interactive news museum located on the fourth floor of the Robert Hoag Rawlings Public Library. Its goal is to increase the knowledge of the history of Pueblo, newspaper processes and First Amendment freedoms namely speech and press. The animatronic newsboy, up-to-date headlines, touch-screen computers, videos and old time printing equipment attract and entertain people of all ages.

The Robert Hoag Rawlings Public Library is located at 100 E. Abriendo Ave. in the heart of Pueblo's Mesa Junction area. To get there from north I -25, take the 98B/First Street Exit. Turn right onto First Street, left on Union Avenue. Travel through the Historic Union Avenue District, turn left on Abriendo Avenue and left on Bates Lane. From south I-25, take the 98B/First Street exit. Turn left onto First Street, left on Union Avenue, left on Abriendo Ave. and left on Bates Lane.

The InfoZone's goal is to increase knowledge about the freedom of speech and press, the history of Pueblo and the newspapers who have served our community.
