## **Huck's adventures on the river**

### **Classic series continues**

The InfoZone News Museum in partnership with the Robert Hoag Rawlings Public Library will host a showing of *The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn* as the second classic movie in the family fun night series.

Bring the entire family for the 4 p.m. showing on May 14 on the InfoZone's 10' x 18' projection screen.

The movies, shown on the second Friday of each month, will feature movies based on books like *20,000 Leagues Under the Sea*, *Ivanhoe*, *Dr. Jeckyll and Mr. Hyde*, *Jayne Eyre* and many more.

May's featured movie starring Mickey Rooney, Walter Connolly and William Frawley, is based on Mark Twain's classic novel, *The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn*. Huck, a teen-aged misfit, finds himself floating on a raft down the Mississippi River with an escaping slave, named Jim. In the course of their journey, Huck and Jim meet adventure, danger, and a cast of characters who are sometimes menacing and often hilarious.

The movie is from MGM/UA Home Video (1989) and is not rated. The featured movie will be shown at 4 p.m. and is free to the public. Seating is limited and reservations must be made. To make a reservation, please call 562-5604.
