A young police constable, stationed near the crime scene, crosses paths with the various people affected by the tragedies and uncovers an unraveling nightmare of guilt and suspicion.

The InfoZone News Museum is an interactive news museum, one of only four news museums in the world. The InfoZone is free to the public and is funded by the Pueblo City-County Library District, The Rawlings Foundation and The Pueblo Chieftain.

"Publick Occurrences Both Foreign and Domestick" was the title of the first newspaper published in the Americas. It was published for the first time and last on September 25, 1690, in Boston, Massachusetts, and was intended to be published monthly, "or, if any Glut of Occurrences happen, oftener." It was printed by Richard Pierce and edited by Benjamin Harris, who had previously published a newspaper in London. The paper contained four six-by-ten inch pages.

The InfoZone News Museum and Robert Hoag Rawlings Public Library are partnering with the Home of Heroes and Pueblo Medal of Honor Foundation and the Historic Arkansas Riverwalk of Pueblo Veterans' Bridge Project to honor military veterans.

At 10 a.m. on Sat., March 7, Doug Sterner, military historian, will present a program on the history of medals in the US Military. Sterner will be available afterward for individual questions about researching your ancestors' medals and military records.

Winners of the "What Freedom Means to Me" essay contest will be honored at a reception planned for 6 p.m. on Tues., March 10 in the Ryals Room on the fourth floor of Rawlings Library.

Representatives of the Pueblo Medal of Honor Foundation and the Historic Arkansas Riverwalk Veteran's Bridge Project will be in the InfoZone from 9 a.m. until 3 p.m. on Sat., March 14 to give the public an update on and answer questions about the project. The fourth floor lobby of Rawlings Library will feature a display of approximately 2,700 names that have already been earmarked for

placement on the bridge. These preview panels will remain on display from March 14 – 31.

Pleasant View Middle School teacher Randy Sandoval will discuss his experience with the 101st Airborne Division, Easy Company, the regiment portrayed in the film *Band of Brothers*. The presentation is planned for 7 p.m. on Monday, March 16th and again at 4 p.m. on Friday, March 20.

The InfoZone has a full line-up of films to mark our month-long celebration of the Home of Heroes. Thursday nights feature films that illustrate the price of freedom that our service men and women pay on our behalf.
